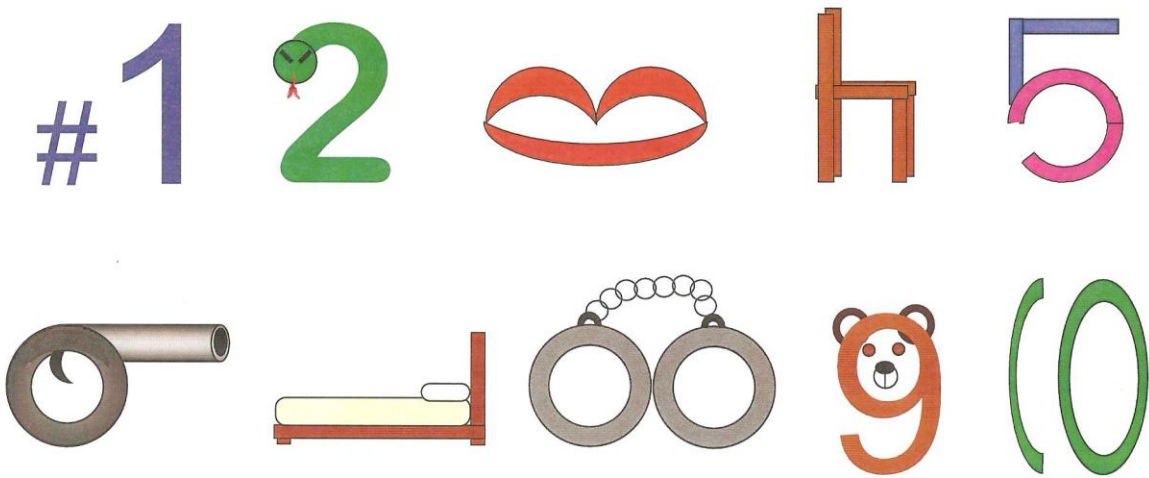


Memorizing the Ten Commandments in Exodus 20

This graphic will help students memorize the Ten Commandments in order. You should be able to mention a commandment such as, "Honor your father and mother" and students should be able to say, "The 5th Commandment."



Here is how it works:

1. The number 1 looks like "We're #1." But who is really #1? God. "Thou shalt have no other gods before me."
2. The number 2 looks like making a serpent and worshipping it. "Thou shalt not make any graven image."
3. The number 3 on its side looks like the top lip. This is the commandment we break with our lips. "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain."
4. The number 4 upside-down looks like a pew or chair in church. "Remember the Sabbath to keep it holy."
5. The number 5 is square at the top part (fathers are square), and round at the bottom (mothers are shapelier). "Honor thy father and thy mother that thy days may be long."
6. The number 6 on its side looks like a gun. "Thou shalt not murder."
7. The number 7 on its side looks like a bed frame. "Thou shalt not commit adultery."
8. The number 8 on its side looks like handcuffs which remind us "Thou shalt not steal."
9. The number 9 looks like a bear. "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor."
10. The number 10 looks like a CO. "Thou shalt not Covet...anything that is thy neighbor's."

The key to learning is to review weekly until you cannot forget the Ten Commandments.

The Ten Commandments are ten moral decisions anyone can make to advance toward success and opportunity.

Ten Commandments Applied



1. Humility is the application of the first commandment.
2. Spiritual worship is the application of the second commandment.
3. Holy reverence is the application of the second commandment.
4. Fellowship, meditation and communion is the application of the fourth commandment.
5. Respecting parents is the application of the fifth commandment t.
6. Respecting human life is the application of the sixth commandment.
7. Respecting marriage is the application of the seventh commandment.
8. Respecting hard work and property is the application of the eighth commandment.
9. Telling the truth and avoiding gossip is the application of the ninth commandment
10. Gratitude and contentment is the application of the tenth commandment.

Ten Commandments and the Moral Law

Doctrines of the Ten Commandments and the Moral Law

41. Wherein is the moral law summarily comprehended?

A. The moral law is summarily comprehended in the ten commandments.[\[additional scriptures\]](#)

42. What is the sum of the ten commandments?

A. The sum of the ten commandments is, to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbor as ourselves.[\[116\]](#)

43. What is the preface to the ten commandments?

A. The preface to the ten commandments is in these words, *I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.*[\[117\]](#)

44. What doth the preface to the ten commandments teach us?

A. The preface to the ten commandments teaches us, that because God is the Lord, and our God, and Redeemer, therefore we are bound to keep all his commandments.[\[118\]](#)

45. Which is the first commandment?

A. The first commandment is, *Thou shalt have no other gods before me.*[\[119\]](#)

46. What is required in the first commandment?

A. The first commandment requires us to know and acknowledge God to be the only true God, and our God; and to worship and glorify him accordingly.[\[120\]](#)

47. What is forbidden in the first commandment?

A. The first commandment forbids the denying,[\[121\]](#) or not worshiping and glorifying, the true God as God,[\[122\]](#) and our God;[\[123\]](#) and the giving of that worship and glory to any other, which is due to him alone.[\[124\]](#)

48. What are we specially taught by these words *before me* in the first commandment?

A. These words *before me* in the first commandment teach us, that God, who sees all things, takes notice of, and is much displeased with, the sin of having any other God.[\[125\]](#)

49. Which is the second commandment?

A. Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; And shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.[\[126\]](#)

50. What is required in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment requires the receiving, observing, and keeping pure and entire, all such religious worship and ordinances as God hath appointed in his Word.[\[127\]](#)

51. What is forbidden in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment forbids the worshiping of God by images,[\[128\]](#) or any other way not appointed in his Word.[\[129\]](#)

52. What are the reasons annexed to the second commandment?

A. The reasons annexed to the second commandment are, God's sovereignty over us,[\[130\]](#) his propriety

in us,[\[131\]](#) and the zeal he hath to his own worship.[\[132\]](#)

53. Which is the third commandment?

A. The third commandment is, *Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain: for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that takes his name in vain.*[\[133\]](#)

54. What is required in the third commandment?

A. The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use of God's names, titles,[\[134\]](#) attributes,[\[135\]](#) ordinances,[\[136\]](#) Word,[\[137\]](#) and works.[\[138\]](#)

55. What is forbidden in the third commandment?

A. The third commandment forbids all profaning or abusing of anything whereby God makes himself known.[\[139\]](#)

56. What is the reason annexed to the third commandment?

A. The reason annexed to the third commandment is, that however the breakers of this commandment may escape punishment from men, yet the Lord our God will not suffer them to escape his righteous judgment.[\[140\]](#)

57. Which is the fourth commandment?

A. The fourth commandment is, *Remember the sabbath day to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.*[\[141\]](#)

58. What is required in the fourth commandment?

A. The fourth commandment requires the keeping holy to God such set times as he hath appointed in his Word; expressly one whole day in seven, to be a holy sabbath to himself.[\[142\]](#)

59. Which day of the seven hath God appointed to be the weekly sabbath?

A. From the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, God appointed the seventh day of the week to be the weekly sabbath;[\[143\]](#) and the first day of the week ever since, to continue to the end of the world, which is the Christian sabbath.[\[144\]](#)

60. How is the sabbath to be sanctified?

A. The sabbath is to be sanctified by a holy resting all that day, even from such worldly employments and recreations as are lawful on other days;[\[145\]](#) and spending the whole time in the public and private exercises of God's worship,[\[146\]](#) except so much as is to be taken up in the works of necessity and mercy.[\[147\]](#)

61. What is forbidden in the fourth commandment?

A. The fourth commandment forbids the omission, or careless performance, of the duties required, and the profaning the day by idleness, or doing that which is in itself sinful, or by unnecessary thoughts, words, or works, about our worldly employments or recreations.[\[148\]](#)

62. What are the reasons annexed to the fourth commandment?

A. The reasons annexed to the fourth commandment are, God's allowing us six days of the week for our own employments,[\[149\]](#) his challenging a special propriety in the seventh, his own example, and his blessing the sabbath day.[\[150\]](#)

63. Which is the fifth commandment?

A. The fifth commandment is, *Honor thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land*

which the Lord thy God gives thee.[\[151\]](#)

64. What is required in the fifth commandment?

A. The fifth commandment requires the preserving the honor, and performing the duties, belonging to everyone in their several places and relations, as superiors, inferiors, or equals.[\[152\]](#)

65. What is forbidden in the fifth commandment?

A. The fifth commandment forbids the neglecting of, or doing anything against, the honor and duty which belongs to everyone in their several places and relations.[\[153\]](#)

66. What is the reason annexed to the fifth commandment?

A. The reason annexed to the fifth commandment is, a promise of long life and prosperity (as far as it shall serve for God's glory and their own good) to all such as keep this commandment.[\[154\]](#)

67. Which is the sixth commandment?

A. The sixth commandment is, *Thou shalt not kill.*[\[155\]](#)

68. What is required in the sixth commandment?

A. The sixth commandment requires all lawful endeavors to preserve our own life, and the life of others.[\[156\]](#)

69. What is forbidden in the sixth commandment?

A. The sixth commandment forbids the taking away of our own life, or the life of our neighbor, unjustly, or whatsoever tends thereunto.[\[157\]](#)

70. Which is the seventh commandment?

A. The seventh commandment is, *Thou shalt not commit adultery.*[\[158\]](#)

71. What is required in the seventh commandment?

A. The seventh commandment requires the preservation of our own and our neighbor's chastity, in heart, speech, and behavior.[\[159\]](#)

72. What is forbidden in the seventh commandment?

A. The seventh commandment forbids all unchaste thoughts, words, and actions.[\[160\]](#)

73. Which is the eighth commandment?

A. The eighth commandment is, *Thou shalt not steal.*[\[161\]](#)

74. What is required in the eighth commandment?

A. The eighth commandment requires the lawful procuring and furthering the wealth and outward estate of ourselves and others.[\[162\]](#)

75. What is forbidden in the eighth commandment?

A. The eighth commandment forbids whatsoever doth, or may, unjustly hinder our own, or our neighbor's wealth or outward estate.[\[163\]](#)

76. Which is the ninth commandment?

A. The ninth commandment is, *Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.*[\[164\]](#)

77. What is required in the ninth commandment?

A. The ninth commandment requires the maintaining and promoting of truth between man and man, and of our own and our neighbor's good name,[\[165\]](#) especially in witness-bearing.[\[166\]](#)

78. What is forbidden in the ninth commandment?

A. The ninth commandment forbids whatsoever is prejudicial to truth, or injurious to our own, or our neighbor's, good name.[\[167\]](#)

79. Which is the tenth commandment?

A. The tenth commandment is, *Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is thy neighbor's.*[\[168\]](#)

80. What is required in the tenth commandment?

A. The tenth commandment requires full contentment with our own condition,[\[169\]](#) with a right and charitable frame of spirit toward our neighbor, and all that is his.[\[170\]](#)

81. What is forbidden in the tenth commandment?

A. The tenth commandment forbids all discontentment with our own estate,[\[171\]](#) envying or grieving at the good of our neighbor, and all inordinate motions and affections to anything that is his.[\[172\]](#)

1	Promote atheism	Thou shalt not have any other god but me.
2	Promote hedonism and environmentalism	Thou shalt not make for yourself an idol.
3	Promote and celebrate profanity	Thou shalt not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
4	Promote secularist indoctrination	Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
5	Promote disrespect of parents	Honor your father and mother.
6	Promote and celebrate abortion	Thou shalt not murder.
7	Promote and celebrate immorality	Thou shalt not commit adultery.
8	Promote taxation and generational theft	Thou shalt not steal.
9	Promote relativism and hatred of truth	Thou shalt not testify falsely against your neighbor.
10	Promote envy and bitterness	Thou shalt not covet your neighbor's house. You must not covet your neighbor's wife.... or anything else that belongs to your neighbor.
